

**STUDENT ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SUSPENSION OF
OPERATIONS OF ANTIOCH COLLEGE**

I, _____, hereby acknowledge the following:

1. I am aware it has been determined that Antioch College, the undergraduate residential campus of Antioch University located in Yellow Springs, Ohio, will suspend operations after the 2007-2008 academic year.

2. I have received and read a copy of the document titled "Plan for Completion of Degrees by Students of Antioch College and Transfer of Students to Other Institutions of Higher Education." Based upon this document, I understand that with assistance and approval from my academic advisor and the Registrar Office I will be responsible for development of Degree Plan in which I will specify conditions under which "I may be able" or "I may be unable" to complete the requirements to receive a degree from Antioch College prior to the end of calendar year 2008. I further understand that the "Plan for Completion of Degrees by Students of Antioch College and Transfer of Students to Other Institutions of Higher Education" referred to above may be modified in the future.

3. I understand that even though I have chosen to enroll as a student at Antioch College, and notwithstanding the statements made in the "Plan for Completion of Degrees by Students of Antioch College and Transfer of Students to Other Institutions of Higher Education," Antioch University has made no promises or guarantees that I will complete the requirements to receive credit from Antioch College or to receive a degree from Antioch College prior to the end of calendar year 2008.

4. I understand that this written Acknowledgement supersedes any other prior or written statements that may have been made to me by any person on behalf of Antioch University relating in any way to my continued enrollment or my ability to complete the requirements to receive a degree from Antioch College and that no future statements that may be made will establish any binding obligation on Antioch College or Antioch University without the express written consent of an authorized representative of Antioch University.

Plan for Completion of Degrees by students of Antioch College
and for transfer of students to other Institutions of Higher Education

To accommodate the special needs of students resulting from the suspension of operation at Antioch College at the end of 2007-08 academic year, a plan for students' transition has been established. This plan will create realistic opportunities for students in the senior (41) and junior (61) status to complete their graduation requirements by the end of the calendar year 2008. For students in second year standing (96) and for first year students (estimated 50-60) the plan for students' transition will provide an opportunity to complete some work on campus and to assist them in transfer to other institutions of higher education. The plan for students' transitions is developed on the following assumption:

- A. The requirements for completion of the degree will remain unchanged and will be the same as at the end of 2006-07 academic year.
- B. The current academic policies and practices will apply.
- C. Students will complete their work within a normal workload as defined in the current academic policies and practices.
- D. Antioch College will provide full staffing of the curriculum during 2007-08 academic year.

Specific conditions and opportunities created for students enrolled during academic year 2007-08 are as follows:

1. Students in senior status. 41 students will enter the Fall 2007 with 84 or more academic credits and with at least 2 completed co-ops. This group of students will be able to complete the 112 credits required for the degree by the end of Spring 2008. In this group, as a normal plan towards the degree, 15 students will need to complete the requirement of the third co-op during the Summer 2008. During the Spring 2008, for this group of students, Antioch College faculty will provide normal pre co-op advising and will secure placement on co-op jobs. During the Summer 2008, Antioch University will provide adequate faculty oversight of the co-ops and support for completion of this requirement.
2. Students in junior status. For the Fall 2007, an estimated 61 students will enter with 56 to 84 credits and two completed co-ops. There are two subgroups among the students in third year standing
 - a. Some of these students will enter with 72 or more credits and two co-ops. These students will be able to complete the 108 credits required for completion of the degree during the Fall 07 and Spring 08. These students will be also able to complete their last co-op and required 4 credits "Place as Text Seminar" during the Summer 2008. During the Spring 2008, for this group of students, Antioch College faculty will provide normal pre co-op advising and will secure placement on co-op jobs. During the Summer

2008, Antioch University will provide adequate faculty oversight of the co-ops, teaching of the "Place as Text" seminar and support for completion of this requirement.

- b. The remaining students will enter with 56 to 71 credits and two completed co-ops. By the end of the Spring 2008, these students will be able to complete a total of 92 to 107 academic credits. During the Summer 2008, these students will be able to complete their last co-op and the required 4 credits "Place as Text" seminar. During the Spring 2008, for this group of students, Antioch College faculty will provide normal pre co-op advising and will secure placement on co-op jobs. During the Summer 2008, Antioch University will provide adequate faculty oversight of the co-ops, teaching of the "Place as Text" seminar, and support for completion of this requirement. In addition, this group of students will have an opportunity to earn remaining 1 – 16 academic credits on programs offered by other campuses of Antioch University or in other accredited institutions of higher education.
3. Students in second year status will be unable to complete their requirements for the degree within 2008 calendar year. These students will be encouraged to transfer to other institutions immediately or to return to campus, enroll into regular load of courses, and transfer to other institutions after the Fall 2007 or after the Spring 2008. In order to assist these students with transfers, Antioch College will develop system of transition advising that will include academic faculty, staff members of the registrar's office, admissions counselors, and financial aid counselors. In addition to transition advising, Antioch College will enter articulation agreements with other campuses of Antioch University, other liberal arts universities colleges of GLCA and ACM consortia, and selected liberal arts institutions around the country. At the beginning of the Fall and Spring semesters, Antioch will invite representatives of these institution to College Fairs.
4. Students of the First year who choose to enter Antioch College at the beginning of the Fall term 2007 will be notified about the suspension of College's activities at the end of Spring 2008 and will be expected to confirm their understanding of this condition in writing.
