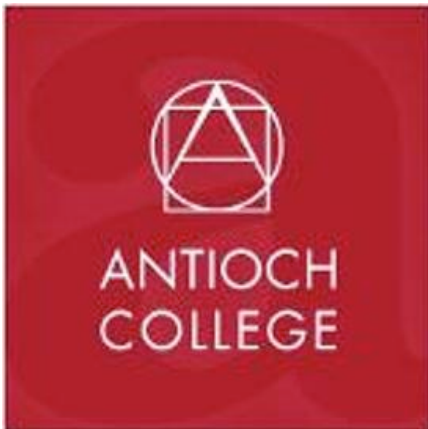

Phineas Gage

Phineas Gage by John Fleischman '71

The fascinating story of the construction foreman who survived for 10 years after a 13-pound iron rod shot through his brain. Fleischman relates Gage's "horrible accident" and the subsequent events in the present tense, giving immediacy to the text. He avoids sensationalizing by letting the events themselves carry the impact. The straightforward description of Gage calmly



chatting on a porch 30 minutes after the accident, for example, comes across as horrifying and amazing. The author presents scientific background in a conversational style and jumps enthusiastically into such related topics as phrenology, 19th-century medical practices, and the history of microbiology. He shows how Gage's misfortune actually played an intriguing and important role in the development of our knowledge of the brain. The present-tense narrative may cause occasional confusion, since it spans several time periods and dates are not always immediately apparent from the text. Illustrations include historical photographs; one showing the iron bar posed dramatically next to Gage's skull is particularly impressive. Other photos and diagrams help explain the workings of the brain. The work of Gage expert Malcolm Macmillan, cited in the list of resources, seems the likely main source for the quotes and details of Gage's life, but this is not clearly spelled out in the text or appendixes. Like Penny Colman's *Corpses, Coffins, and Crypts* (Holt, 1997) and James M. Deem's *Bodies from the Bog* (Houghton, 1998), *Phineas Gage* brings a scientific viewpoint to a topic that will be delightfully gruesome to many readers.

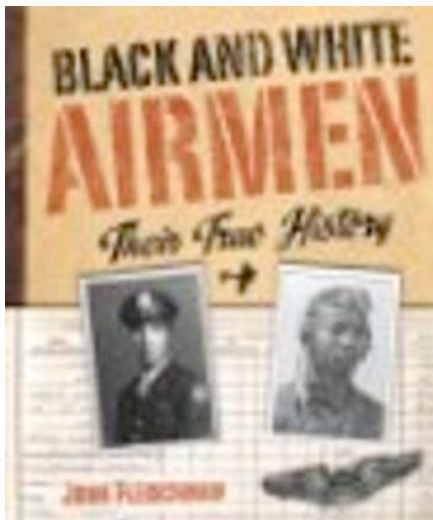

John Lehr and Herb Heilbrun have lived parallel lives. They grew up in the same neighborhood in Cincinnati, OH, attended the same elementary school, and both served as pilots during World War II. They were even in the same third-grade class, and there is a picture of them standing side by side to prove it. In spite of this, they never knew each other. Lehr is African American and Heilbrun is Caucasian. It never would have occurred to them that they could be friends back then, but, having met in 1997 at a reception honoring Tuskegee Airmen, they are now best friends and travel the country talking about their experiences. While the book is a record primarily of these two men's memories of the war, the similarities in their backgrounds force the differences caused by race into stark relief. Fleischman has compiled these memories, providing a good deal of historical context about segregation and events of the war. As he did with *Phineas Gage* (Houghton, 2002), the author has found the perfect hook

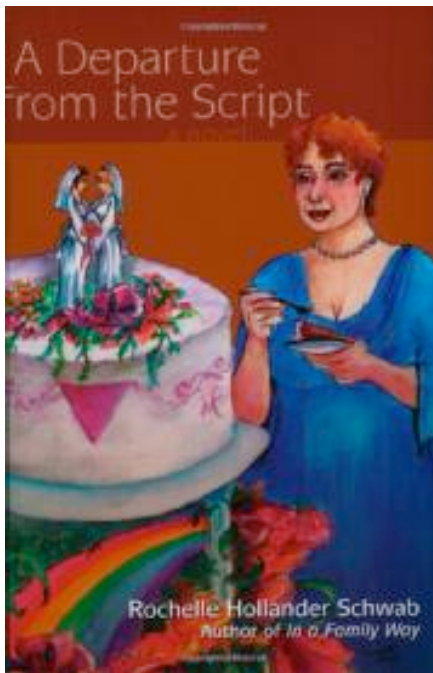

When her 25-year-old daughter, Jenny, announces that she is a lesbian and has met a woman she loves, Sheila Katz tries to take pleasure in her daughter's happiness but finds that her husband is unwilling to do the same. Dan is convinced that Jenny is only going through a phase and that once she meets the right man, she'll realize her mistake. Sheila finds the monthly PFLAG (Parents and Friends of Lesbians and Gays) meetings extremely helpful, but after he attends one, Dan refuses to go back. When Jenny and Tamara ask for Sheila's support in planning (and helping to pay for) their traditional Jewish wedding, she further incurs Dan's anger by agreeing. At the same time, Sheila finds her own heretofore-unquestioned heterosexuality challenged when she realizes that she is strongly attracted to a lesbian artist. Schwab's touch is light, but her message is earnest (and only occasionally didactic). She raises difficult issues as she shows how families can support and accept their children who come out to them as a gay, lesbian, or bisexual. Nancy Pearl

When Shel started looking at ethics in the wake of those scandals, he realized that the Abundance Principle was absolutely crucial to ethical companies' success. In fact, if you approach the world ethically, with an attitude of abundance, the world lets you tap into that abundance and the things you seek somehow come to you. (The whole of Chapters 6, 7, 8, and 9 explore this idea in detail, using examples from Apple Computer and Nordstrom down to one-person home businesses.) The Meaninglessness of Market Share

For most of us, market share is completely irrelevant. Let's look at Shel's business as an example. He writes,

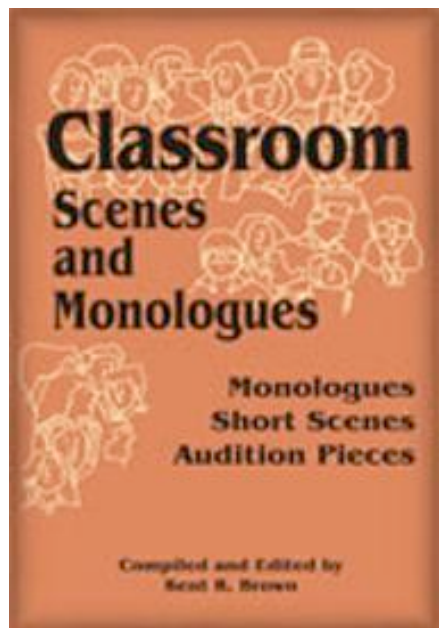

What does it matter to me if I don't have all the work there is to do? I couldn't handle even a tiny percentage of it anyway. There's plenty to go around because the world is abundant. Another, much bigger example is Southwest Airlines. 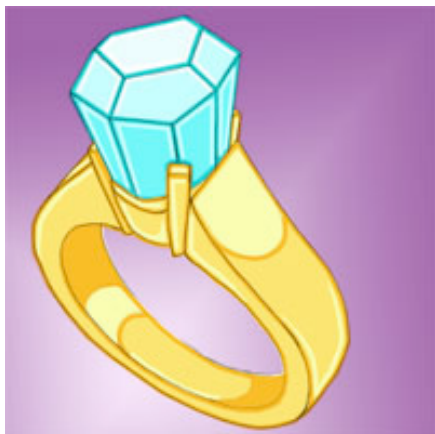

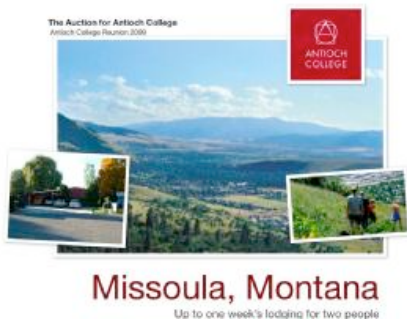
