Bruce retired as an Executive VP at John Nuveen Company, Inc., in Chicago and was responsible for overseeing and guiding the growth, strategy, marketing, and development of Nuveen's \$50 billion Mutual Funds, Investment Trusts and Exchange Traded Funds. 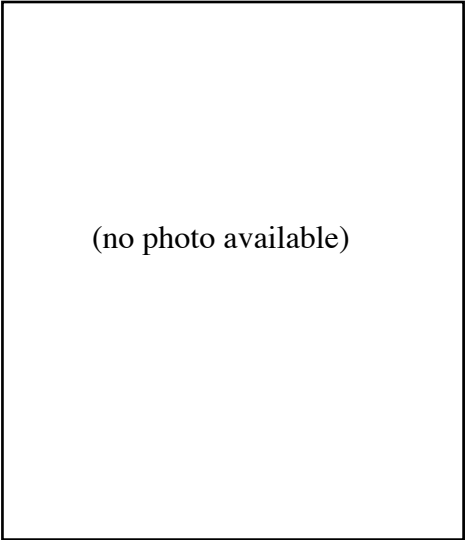

Dan is currently Chair of the Carnegie Corporation's Education Division where he oversees the Corporation education priorities, including adolescent literacy, urban school reform, and teacher ed reform. With support from the Corporation, he founded a national effort called the Project 30 Alliance, which is redesigning the way new teachers are educated in the U.S. His B.A. in Psychology is from Antioch, and he has an M.A. and Ph.D. in Experimental Psych from the University of Virginia.

He began his teaching career at State University of New York at Binghamton where he served on the faculty, then as Assistant and later Associate Dean of Arts of Sciences. Dan spent a year in Germany at the University of Dusseldorf as a Senior Fulbright Research fellow and visiting professor of psychology. He delivered many lectures on American higher education for audiences throughout Germany. 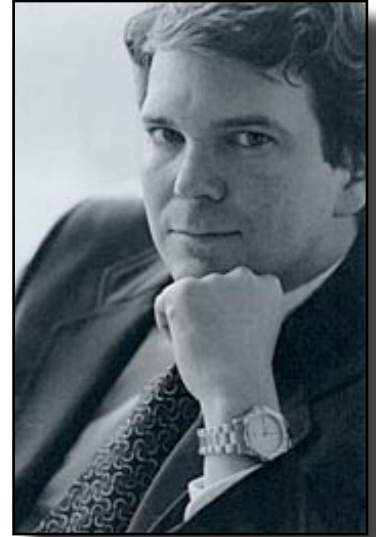

Reuben T. Harris '69, of Keene, New Hampshire, earned his B.S. in Engineering at Antioch College, his M.B.A. from the University of Rochester, and his Ph.D. in Business (Organizational Behavior) from Stanford University.
