Proposal and Budget

The Coversheet, Co-op Planning & Registration Form, Employer Confirmation, Proposal and Budget constitute your Scholarship Application. Below are instructions for the Proposal and Budget.

1. In 500 words or less, **the proposal** should be a narrative explanation of your reasons for doing this co-op and its relationship to your Antioch program. When possible, make reference to relevant course work. The narrative proposal should name and describe the organization which will employ you (include supporting materials from them if available); your work responsibilities and learning agenda for the work term and the role these will play in your personal goals as well as the development of your program. Include dates, itinerary, and other relevant data to aid the committee in understanding your proposal. Attach your narrative to this cover sheet. Please type or use a word processor.
2. **The budget** should show four sorts of information:
 - An estimate of the costs involved in doing the co-op including travel to the co-op, rent, food, transportation while on the job, special equipment if necessary, visa fees, and other relevant costs.
 - Your contribution, if any, including co-op stipend and money saved for this purpose (if none, explain briefly).
 - The contribution of cash and/or kind from your co-op employer.
 - The amount requested from the co-op scholarships (currently awards range from \$350 to no more than \$2000).

Policies Governing the Use of Scholarships for Co-op (a.k.a. The Fine Print)

- All applications require a proposal and budget, a Co-op Planning and Registration Form with learning objectives, and a confirmation of employment from the employer.
- Additional application materials for some co-op scholarships are available from the Co-op Office.
- Applicants must be up to date with co-op crediting.
- Applicants must be in good standing in regard to co-op, academics and the Dean of Students Office (i.e. not on Warning or Probation).
- Under federal guidelines, a scholarship CANNOT be used to replace the federally determined family contribution if the student is receiving ANY type of federal aid in his or her award.
- Unless otherwise indicated application **DEADLINES** are Friday of the 9th week of Fall and Spring terms and end of Summer term second block before the Co-op. Some application deadlines do vary, so be sure to check.
- Co-op scholarships must be used during the co-op term for which application is made.
- Funds cannot be disbursed before or unless the co-op is confirmed.
- Award recipients are asked to write a note to the donor expressing their appreciation for the support.
- Decisions will be made prior to the first co-op term registration deadline.

International Co-ops

Show financial need and a strong interest in the perpetuation of the State of Israel. Must have completed one full year at Antioch prior to travel, demonstrate strong academic performance, and must share with the community upon return from Israel. (Additional info in co-op office.)
