Pupil of Mieczyslaw Munz, Artur Rubinstein and Myra Hess, Ann Schein is the consummate interpreter of Chopin and his generation. She has performed in the White House and in 50 foreign countries, and she was a master teacher at the Peabody Conservatory for 20 years. This year, the *Washington Post* wrote, "Thank heaven for Ann Schein. [She] simply reaches right into the heart of whatever she is playing—and creates music so powerful you cannot tear yourself away."

A duo-piano team since the age of five, identical twins Richard and John Contiguglia graduated summa cum laude from Yale. They also studied with Dame Myra Hess and have risen to a position of preeminence in duo-piano and four-hands performance. "The most profoundly musical pair of piano virtuosos of this century," said Edward Tatnall Canby. They will perform an unusual program entirely of original works for two pianists.

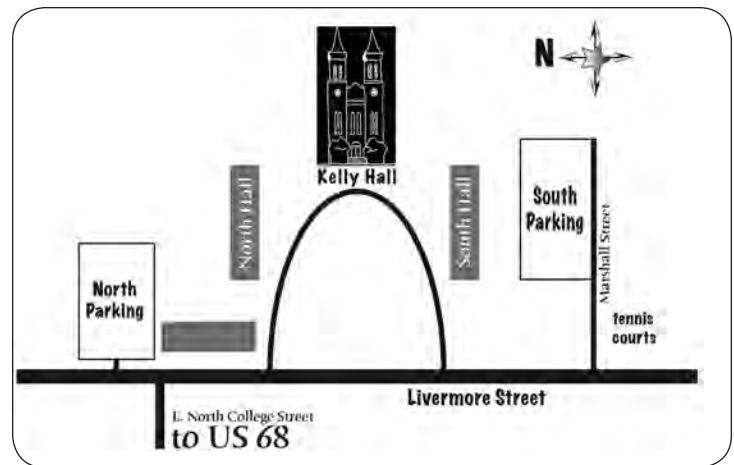
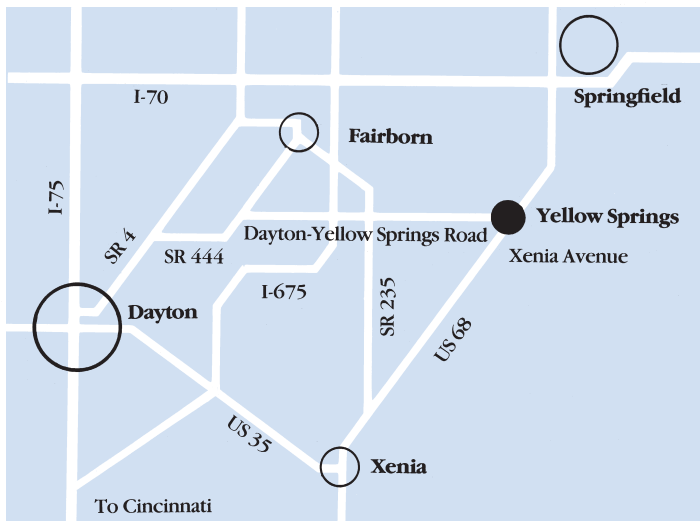
