APPLICATION DEADLINES – When Do I Need to Apply for Aid?

- Students must apply for financial aid each year to receive assistance for the academic year which begins with Summer term.
- March 1, 2000 is the priority deadline for continuing students. To meet this deadline FAFSA results, the Antioch Financial Aid Application and copies of W-2s must be received by March 1, and tax returns must be post-marked no later than April 15. Students who fail to meet the deadline will receive less Antioch Grant than if they had applied on time; the later the materials are received, the greater the reduction in Antioch Grant.
- Students from Alaska, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Vermont and the District of Columbia must apply for State Grants by the states' deadlines. Failure to do so may result in less aid; students will be responsible to pay the amount the state grant would have been.
- Entering students should apply for financial aid as early as possible but are afforded more flexibility in deadlines in their first year. However, it is to their advantage to apply for aid early as some types of assistance are limited and may no longer be available to late applicants.

REQUIRED APPLICATION MATERIALS – What Do I Need to Submit to Apply for Aid?

ALL students applying for need-based financial aid must submit ALL of the following:

1. The **results** of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the Renewal Application. Since it may take the Federal Student Aid Program several weeks to process an application, you will need to file the FAFSA with enough time to meet the priority deadline of March 1. List Antioch with our federal school code **003010** so we receive your results electronically. **Send to the federal processor at the address provided in the application.**
Applying over the internet at: <http://www.fafsa.ed.gov> may be faster than completing a paper application. If you apply on-line, be sure to print out, sign, date and send the Certification/Signature Page to the federal processor. To meet the March 1 deadline, we suggest you file the FAFSA based on estimated data if necessary; we will make electronic corrections once we receive your other application materials. Be sure you answer all questions on the FAFSA and that your application is signed and dated.
2. **The Antioch Financial Aid Application** — this form. Be sure to answer all questions; if an answer is Not Applicable or "0" indicate that. Don't forget to sign and date your application. **Send to the Financial Aid Office at Antioch.**
3. All **1999 W-2s** for parents and student. **Send copies to the Financial Aid Office at Antioch.**
4. A copy of **1999 federal tax returns** for parents and student. Be sure these are signed and that all schedules are included. If a Telefile form was filed, it must be signed, dated and indicate the 6-digit confirmation number. If a corporate or partnership tax return was filed, including subchapter S corporations, include complete 1120S or 1065P returns and balance sheets. **Send copies to the Financial Aid Office at Antioch.**

If the Financial Aid Office determines that additional information is required, it will be requested. Such documentation may include: The Divorced/Separated Parent's Statement, a Verification of Sibling Enrollment at another institution, and A Supplemental Information Form. Students who are independent according to federal guidelines may need to submit parental tax returns and W-2s to determine eligibility for institutional aid.

GENERAL POLICIES

Families have the primary responsibility for meeting college costs from income, assets and accumulated savings of parents and student. The financial aid program seeks to make Antioch College financially accessible to students who could not otherwise afford the expense of attending the college. The primary criteria for awarding of financial aid is demonstrated financial need.

Financial aid programs include grants, scholarships, work-study, and loans. In addition to gift aid, resources from Social Security, Scholarships, Trust Funds, and Veterans Benefits are considered part of the financial aid package. Loans and work-study are usually components of the financial aid package. Each student who receives a financial aid award may be asked to borrow a specified amount from the Federal Direct Loan Program; some may be asked to borrow from the Federal Perkins Loan Program. Each student who receives financial aid may be awarded Federal Work-Study to earn money to help with the cost of education. Gift aid in the form of Federal Supplemental Opportunity Grants and Antioch Grants (discount) is offered if a student has remaining need.
